## Speakers – Day 2



Martin Lawlor Chief Executive, Port of Blyth & Chair, British Ports Association

Martin Lawlor is Chief Executive of the Port of Blyth and Chair of the British Ports Association.

Appointed Chief Executive by Blyth Harbour Commission in 2006 having previously held the roles of Deputy Chief Executive and Commercial & Operations Director, Martin also acts as Chairman of the port's logistics company 'Transped'.

Under his guidance the Port of Blyth has grown its trade and client list significantly and is seen as a key strategic UK offshore energy base. Now one of the largest ports of its kind in the UK, Blyth is known as an ambitious and customer focused, modern port operation. Having established the nationally significant Energy Central initiative with Northumberland County Council, further major growth around the Blyth Estuary is anticipated. Prior to joining the Commission in 1994, he held various commercial management roles at the ports of Tees & Hartlepool.

Martin is a council member of Maritime UK and sits on the executive group of Subsea NE.



**Dr David Dobbin CBE** Chairman, Belfast Harbour

Dr David Dobbin CBE was appointed to the Belfast Harbour Board in 2012 and took up the position of Chairman in 2015. He has extensive board level

experience across the private, public and voluntary sectors and is currently a member of the KPMG Northern Ireland Advisory Board. He has been actively involved in promoting economic development especially in the Agrifood sector and was Chairman of Dairy UK and was appointed as an expert to the EU Agri Markets Task Force in 2016.

David has wide industrial experience having previously held a number of senior executive roles in the Dairy, Agrifood and Print and Packaging sectors. He has also served as Chairman of a number of organisations including: Dairy UK, Ulster Rugby, the Northern Ireland Food & Drink Association, the Strategic Investment Board, Inter Trade Ireland, the Prince's Trust NI, CBI NI, the NI Centre for Competitiveness and as President of the Northern Ireland Grain Trade. He has also served as a Non-Executive on the boards. of Food from Britain, the NI Aarifood Strategy Board, Invest NI, BT Ireland and Queen's University Senate. A passionate rugby enthusiast, Dr Dobbin was Chairman of Ulster Rugby and Vice Chair of Ireland/Northern Ireland's 2023 Rugby World Cup bid.

A First Class Honours Graduate in Mechanical Engineering from Queen's University, Dr Dobbin has also completed post graduate business courses at the London and Harvard Business Schools and is a Fellow of the Institute of Directors and a Chartered Engineer. In addition to receiving the CBE for services to Industry, Dr Dobbin has received a number of awards including the Institute of Directors Large Company Director of the Year, the IOD Lunn's Award for Leadership and an honorary Chinese citizenship by the city of Kunshan in recognition of his service to economic development in China.

**Shanker Singham** Chairman of the Technical Panel of the Prosperity UK Alternative Arrangements Commission and CEO of Competere Ltd

Shanker is Chairman of the Technical Panel of the

Prosperity UK Alternative Arrangements Commission, which has published a report setting out how Alternative Arrangements could work to ensure there is no hard border in Ireland and which respects the supremacy of the Belfast-Good Friday Agreement.

Shanker is one of the world's leading trade and competition lawyers and CEO of Competere Ltd., a company focused on promoting international trade and competition policy throughout the world. He is also the Director of the International Trade and Competition Unit (ITCU) at the Institute of Economic Affairs and is an IEA Academic Fellow. The ITCU is focused on providing advice to the UK government, industry and media on the Brexit negotiations, among other trade policy issues.

As one of the world's leading trade and competition lawyers, he has worked on the privatization of the UK electricity market, the transition of the Soviet, Central and Eastern European economies and the apertura in Latin America. He has worked on the accession of Poland and Hungary to the EU, the WTO accessions of a number of countries, including China and Russia. He built the Latin American trade practice of Steel Hector and Davis in Miami and led the market access practices of Steel Hector and Davis in Miami, and Squire Sanders in Washington, DC.

Shanker is the founder of the International Roundtable on Trade and Competition (1997), the Competitiveness and Enterprise Cities Project ("CECP") (2013), and the lead author of the SRB economic model to measure Anti-Competitive Market Distortions. He has worked on a number of trade negotiations including the Free Trade Area of the Americas, US-Colombia, US-Peru, US-Panama, TTIP and TPP. He was also co-chair of the small business working group of the Transatlantic Business Dialogue.

Shanker has an M.A in Chemistry from Balliol College, Oxford University and postgraduate legal degrees in both the UK and US (at the Guildford College of Law, and University of Miami Law School).

> **Eamonn Butler** Director and co-founder, Adam Smith Institute

Dr Eamonn Butler is Director and co-founder of the Adam Smith Institute, one of the world's leading policy think tanks, based in

Westminster. He is author of widely-translated books on a wide range of subjects, from economics through psychology to politics, his latest being The Streetwise Guide to the UK Economy. He holds a PhD from St Andrews and an Honorary DLitt from Heriot-Watt, is a former winner of the National Free Enterprise Award, and currently sits on the government's Freeport's advisory panel.



**Tim Reardon** Head of EU Exit & Company Secretary, Port of Dover

Tim Reardon is the Port of Dover's Company Secretary and leads on the technical work with HM Government to ensure that traffic

continues to flow smoothly through the port once the UK leaves the EU, and that the vital supply chains that rely on those flows are not disrupted. With 25 years experience in the ro-ro sector, specialising in the design and management of border controls on freight and passenger traffic, he previously worked for the Chamber of Shipping, representing ferry operators in their dealings with HMRC, Defra, the Home Office and the Border Force.



Brian Johnson Chief Executive, Maritime & Coastguard Agency

Brian graduated in chemical engineering at Cambridge University and worked at Imperial Chemical Industries for

15 years doing research work, technology development, site production management and business restructuring leadership. Whilst working in Louisiana (USA) in the early '90s, he led the design and commissioning of the world's first industrial scale plant making ozone friendly refrigerants.

After a short spell at Tate and Lyle, he moved to Remploy for 4 years, a company employing 6,000 disabled people in its extensive manufacturing activities around 80 UK sites, where he was Operations Director. The introduction of intensive personal learning activity and full engagement of factory teams in improvement work created productivity gains of up to 60% and gave many of the employees the confidence to find employment outside Remploy.

He moved to the affordable housing sector where he was CEO of 3 companies over 13 years. Most recently of Metropolitan. Over 5 years, he led a team that turned around Metropolitan from near collapse to a sector high performer - substantially increasing its annual profits from a break even position, re-establishing a large new build programme, and making significant, lasting improvement to the personal resilience of 17,000 customers per year.

Brian joined the Maritime and Coastguard Agency as Chief Executive in October 2018.



Captain Mark Sansom Chief Executive & Harbour Master, Falmouth Harbour Commissioners

Captain Mark Sansom has been the Chief Executive and Harbour Master of the port of Falmouth (UK)

since 2000. He is a qualified master mariner having had a sea career with the Royal Fleet Auxiliary followed by 3 years working for the Sultan of Oman's Royal Yacht Squadron. He also worked as a salvage and mooring officer for the UK Ministry of Defence prior to coming to Falmouth as Deputy Harbour Master in 1992.

Mark was promoted to Chief Executive and Harbour Master in 2000 and immediately managed an ambitious programme of change which included a major reform of governance as well as the management of marine safety following the introduction of the Port Marine Safety Code. He has also overseen the reform of local pilotage arrangements to make them more effective and accountable.

Due to the strategic location of Falmouth, Mark has gained considerable experience in the field of receiving marine casualties into ports. He was the BPA representative on the working group for revising the National Contingency Plan on the last 2 occasions.

Mark is a member of the British Ports Association Council and has previously been on the Council of the UK Harbour Master's Association as well as the Board of the European Harbour Master's Congress.



#### Captain Don Cockrill MBE CMMar FNI Secretary General, UK Maritime Pilots' Association

A Chartered Master Mariner, following eighteen years of a commercial seafaring career during

which he progressed from cadet to master specialising in petro-chemicals, he joined the Port of London Authority as a pilot in 1991, where he still works as one of the senior pilots.

Concurrently throughout almost all of that period he has been involved one way or another in the administration and work of the United Kingdom Maritime Pilots' Association most recently in the role of Secretary General. Don was awarded an MBE in the 2017 New Year's Honours for voluntary services to Maritime Pilotage and the Port Industry.

He is passionate about the promotion of safety issues and the maintenance of the highest professional standards. His significant lifelong experience and associated expertise in maritime operations within the ports and shipping industries is widely sought after.



**Stephan Hennig** The Secretary of State's Representative for Maritime Salvage and Intervention

Stephan joined the Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA) at MRCC Shetland in 2005 and served in HM

Coastguard until 2012 when he became the Counter Pollution and Salvage Officer for Scotland and Northern Ireland. He provided an MCA regional point of contact for a wide variety of stakeholders including ports, offshore operators, environmental regulators, Local Authorities and many others.

In March 2017 Stephan joined the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) on a secondment with the Offshore Petroleum Regulator for Environment and Decommissioning (OPRED) and was officially appointed Deputy to the SOSREP later that year. Stephan acted in the role of SOSREP since May 2018 and was officially appointed SOSREP in January 2019. In maritime incident response, he works closely with other government departments, salvage companies, P&I Clubs and the many other interested parties. In his different roles, he has managed many incidents from Search & Rescue to wreck removal and attended a variety of shipping casualties.



Ashley Nicholson Senior Harbour Master, Forth Ports

Ashley Nicholson joined Forth Ports Limited in 2008 as a VTS Officer and has served in various roles within the marine

department before taking over her current role of Senior Harbour Master in 2017 looking after a number of Ports including one of the UK's largest ports Grangemouth. She graduated with a BSc in Nautical Science in 2007 and also gained the MCA endorsed HM Certificate. Ashley is currently the Vice President of the United Kingdom Harbour Master Association and will take on the role of President mid 2020.
